






Otter Award Nominee





Interviewing Your Characters

Last month I wrote about realistic characters, and how important they should be to a writer. But how do we actually accomplish this? One way is to pretend the character is real, and that you're interviewing them. You could write down some questions on a paper, and respond to them as if you're the character. Sounds complicated? It's not. And it's very fun too. Ask your characters questions like what they like to do in their


free time, and how they express anger or sadness. Ask them their favorite novel or their worst memory. All these may not go into your story, but they'll certainly create a fully formed character to write about.
